NJBAC Cannabis Training Academy Pillars

EDUCATE. NJBAC has prepared a course catalog for over 60 courses pertaining to application preparedness, business plan development and tutorials for application submission. *All courses will be available at no cost.*

EMPOWER. NJBAC shall onboard instructors with cannabis related experience and a track record of success in their respective field to teach courses.

ESTABLISH. NJBAC shall onboard mentors for each course to provide additional support through on-going mentorship for prospective cannabis entrepreneurs.

NJBAC Cannabis Training Academy Format

Classes will be available virtual, on demand. Students learn at their own pace. Courses will be a mix of PowerPoint, video instruction, and supporting course material. Transcripts will be available for each course/video; all videos will be captioned and made available as an audio file as well. *All courses will be translated into Spanish.*

Live Q&A sessions by mentors from the industry will help students with their individual questions, initially, once every two weeks. More sessions may be added as required.

Instructors & Mentors Providing Access to Vetted Professionals

- All instructors and mentors shall go through a proper vetting process to ensure they are knowledgeable in their respective fields and can relay information in a way that is relatable and digestible.
- Instructors shall teach courses, prepare supplementary materials, and hold weekly virtual office hours.
- Mentors shall be assigned to specific courses & hold weekly virtual Q&A sessions with students.
- Students, instructors, and mentors are free to engage with one another for services.



How do I approach a prospective municipality? Guidance on how to work with municipalities, ask the right questions, and gain the approval you need.


What else do I need to disclose? This course will provide an overview of disclosure forms including fingerprinting and criminal history background check requirements.

EIN Number: Your EIN # registers your company for federal tax purposes. Once you know your name is available, visit <u>www.IRS.gov</u>

Create Legal Entity/Business Registration to set up your legal structure and all your accounts, including employee withholding and state taxes. Visit: <u>https://www.nj.gov/treasury/revenue/gettingregistered.shtml</u>
